New Appointments and Alignments for Apostolic Collaboration

Upon much prayer and reflection with the entire International Council of ICAL, I have appointed apostles Jan-Aage Torp and Ron Cottle to new functions.

Apostolic Communications Facilitator

Jan-Aage Torp of Oslo, Norway, who is the Convenor of ECAL, has been appointed as the Apostolic Communications Facilitator of ICAL.

In his new expanded function, Jan-Aage Torp's role as the ICAL Apostolic Communications Facilitator is primarily to express ICAL as a movement, its values and principles, based on Biblical imperatives and teachings, that add to the growth and development of the Church, the Kingdom of God, and the New Apostolic Reformation (NAR).

Jan-Aage Torp will be facilitating our official communications through web, Facebook and Twitter.

However, his function goes beyond the dissemination of information that is of an administrative nature. Most of those things will be directly posted from Mark Pfeifer, or his executive administrator Bryce Eldrigde, and from myself, or my administrative communication executive, Lynn Kishaba.

Jan-Aage Torp will be working closely with myself, Mark Pfeifer and Ron Cottle in our international communications, and will facilitate the communications from Latin-America

Facilitator Fernando Guillen and other continental and/or national convenors and ambassadors, as they emerge, and their members and administrative representatives.

International Theological Facilitator

Ron Cottle of Columbus, Georgia, USA, has been appointed as the International Theological Facilitator of ICAL.

Dr. Ron Cottle has a Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) in Religion from the University of Southern California, Los Angeles, and has extensive education in the field of theology, as well as Greek and Hebrew language.

There has been much concern regarding expressions, Biblical interpretations and pronouncements made by some who consider themselves, and are considered by others, to be voices of the NAR. I would like to make a very clear statement that they may be voices **within** the apostolic movement, but not **of** the apostolic movement. The preponderance of apostolically gifted leaders within the movement holds to Biblical orthodoxy, and practice proper hermeneutics and exegesis of Scripture. Throughout the globe, apostolically gifted leaders primarily believe in a victorious church.

I have appointed Dr. Cottle as the International Theological Facilitator of a council of globally representative, theologically knowledgable and gifted apostolic leaders within ICAL. This theological council will be appointed by he and I to be collaborators in putting together explanative white papers concerning theological and doctrinal positions. Dr. Cottle's desire is to assemble an annual journal of a compilation of these white papers which will be given out to all attendees of ICAL's annual gathering, and afterwards sold throughout the year.

This may be seen as corrective to some, and it is a course correction for proper Biblical understanding with a Biblical worldview. You will be hearing and reading more about this work in the future, under Dr. Cottle's facilitation.
